



Children with SEN or disabilities – Information for parents

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) states: Providers must have arrangements in place to support children with SEN or disabilities. Maintained schools, maintained nursery schools and all providers who are funded by the local authority to deliver early education places must have regard to the Special Educational Needs Code of Practice. Childminders are encouraged to identify a person to act as a SENCO and childminders who are registered with a childminder agency or who are part of a network may wish to share the role between them.' We have a copy of the latest version of the SEND Code of Practice on the computer and comply with the requirements of the Equality Act (2010) and any further requirements from the Local Authority.

We aim to be fully inclusive and ensure no child is disadvantaged because of ethnicity, culture or religion, home language, family background, learning difficulties or disabilities, gender, or ability. We aim to support the individual needs of each child who attends the setting, and the environment is adapted as required.

We aim to treat all children as individuals and encourage them to respect themselves and others. We aim to include all children in activities and celebrate their family's special days. We demonstrate equality of opportunity and diversity in books, posters, music, and movement sessions, displays and other resources throughout the setting. We help children learn about the multicultural and diverse society in which we live through planned outings in the local community and further afield.

If we believe a child is eligible for funding related to their special educational needs and / or disabilities, we will speak to you and discuss how this can be claimed, to help us better support your child.
